LD (PE Leader) received the finalised version in early July so with help from AF (Deputy PE Leader), we allocated units to all KS2 classes. All classes will access units on gymnastics, dance, outdoor and adventure, invasion games, net and wall and striking &amp; fielding. (For example Y5 Invasion - Rugby whereas Y6 Invasion - Hi 5). AF and I looked at L 1 &amp; 2 competitions, key skills, and teachers' new national curriculum topics to ensure the PE curriculum is board and balanced. Teachers have flexibility to move the units around based on timetables, specialised coaching, venues etc if approved by LD/AF.</p> <p><b>Top Cards</b> After teachers stating the Top cards were dated, NF (RQT) went onto a TOP Sport course in December 2013. As NQT she had the opportunity to learn about quality PE and how to break skills down. NF brought back a link containing information about Top cards and how they can support the teaching of the new national curriculum. LD emailed each teacher with the link and AF successfully downloaded the cards and placed them into dropbox.</p> <p><b>Early Years Foundation Stage</b> JH (Nursery Nurse) attended the Early Years Foundation Stage Training in Spring. LD/JH has piloted a unit last academic unit and will continue to use the scheme in the present academic unit. Early Years children worked with the School Sports Partnership, Chorley Sports Development as well as the PE leader and deputy PE leader. **KS1 Curriculum Update**

Sadly the KS1 scheme of work and course was postponed due to the advisory teacher being off sick. AF is hoping to attend the course in autumn and allocate units to KS1 classes alongside LD.

**Chorley School Sports Partnership**

We have paid in full to the SSP and will receive a block of coaching/extra curriculum activities each term. We will have approximately 120hrs of coaching which will be allocated fairly across school. LD/AF spoke to teachers to see which units of PE they were less confident with and how the Chorley School Sports Partnership could best support PE at St George's. Based on the evidence gathered, LD contacted the Chorley SSP with a request.

**Other Agencies**

The SLT team successfully organised a Health and Fitness Week during National Schools Sports Week. As part of the event, Children from all age groups had opportunities to take part and compete in a wide range of sporting activities. Activities included: Athletics, Bochia, Street Dancing, Life Education Van (Health/Fitness), Skipping, Climbing Wall, Cycling, Football, Sports Day, Orienteering etc.

The SLT have changed the schools provider of Bike Ability after discussions with LD (PE leader). This additional money will come out of PE premium money and not the Chorley SSP core service.

The SSP will invite children deemed to be G&amp;T to specialised G&amp;T camps out of school hours. A high proportion of children were invited last year and the school used parts of his budget to pay for a G&amp;T y6 girl to attend a G&amp;T event delivered by the Chorley SSP at the Anderton Centre. Teachers will continue to track attainment/national curriculum levels using the core tasks in the scheme of work. EH has earned a TLR and is now responsible for G&amp;T register.</p> <p><b>Inter Competition</b> St George's won the Chorley award for the amount of L2 competitions entered last academic year. The SSP have been in and delivered intra competitions for all pupils from FS - KS2. Teachers have created opportunities for intra competition as part of PE lessons at the end of units. We like to increase this again by school staff organising intra school competitions to increase numbers of participants and to further raise the profile of our rainbow house colours.</p> <p><b>Clubs</b> We are very lucky at St George's to have so many adults who give up their time to deliver extracurricular activities.
