
# **Class 5 Curricular Letter**



#### Autumn 1

#### Dear Parents,

Welcome back and welcome to Class 5! I am thrilled to be the class teacher of such a wonderful group of children. The children have had a fantastic first week in school and are all excited about the term ahead. This year Mrs Fothergill will be teaching RE in Class 5 on Thursday mornings and our teaching assistant is Jonny Robinson. We have a jam-packed year ahead with lots of exciting topics. Our first topic is "Why isn't there a beach in Chorley?" and we will be finding this out by visiting a real beach later in the term. Look out for more details in the coming weeks. In DT we will be designing and making the best beach hut flag ever! Why not have a chat with your child about the topics below:



### Literacy

In our first literacy unit, we will write our own seaside story to be broadcast on the school radio. During this topic we will read, enjoy and analyse The Storm Whale by Benji Davies. We will answer questions about the story, discuss the character's thoughts and feelings and make predictions. We will also identify and use adjectives to describe the characters and settings, using full stops, capital letters and question marks to punctuate sentences. Later in the half term, we will read and write letters and postcards, learning about the conventions of these text types. <u>You can help at home by:</u>

- Reading stories with a seaside theme, looking at pictures of the seaside and discussing words (adjectives) to describe the setting.
- Getting outdoors and discussing what you can see with your child, asking questions and encouraging your child to describe objects in detail.

## Reading

In daily guided reading and in our phonics sessions, Year 2 will continue to develop their reading skills. This will include word reading and understanding the text. We will change reading books on a Monday and a Friday, but please make sure your child's book bag is in school **every day**. Your child will also have access to more reading books on Bug Club. You can help by:

- Reading and discussing books on a regular basis to consolidate your child's development. As little as 10 minutes a night makes a huge difference!
- Access books online on Bug Club: full of wonderful books at your child's reading level.

# Spelling

We will follow the Spelling Shed programme for our spellings in Year 2. Spellings will be sent out on a Friday via a Seesaw announcement and tested the following Friday. <u>You can help by:</u>

Encouraging your child to practise their spellings on the Spelling Shed app at least 3 times a week.

## Maths

During the first part of this half term Class 5 will learn the properties of numbers to 100 including how many tens and units each number has. We will then move onto counting in steps of 2, 5 and 10 to 100 and explore addition and subtraction using number bonds as well as base 10. <u>You can help at home by:</u>

- Practice saying number bonds to 10, 20 and 100. Why not try a simple game on the way to school "I shout 8, your child shouts 2." Little and often is better!
- Look out for 2-digit numbers around you and ask your child to name them and describe how many tens and ones they have. Can they tell you which number comes next and which one comes before?
- Complete the MYMaths activity weekly, which will be linked the maths quiz for the following week.
