

# Literacy

We will be looking at Folk Tales this half term, in particular, The Tin Forest. The children will explore a range of Folk Tales in school. You can help your child at home by reading Folk Tales together at home.

While we read, we will be looking at prepositions (e.g. above, beyond, under). Later in the term, we will look at shape poems as we move into the festive season. We will be reading and analysing poems in order to plan and write our own.

### Reading

Your child will take part in a guided reading lessons throughout the week. In these lessons, they will respond to a range of activities from a chosen text. Our first book this half term is called The Butterfly Lion by Michael Morpurgo.

# Maths



This half term, the children will be focussing on subtraction followed by multiplication and division. We will be using our times table knowledge to help answer word problems in real life situations. Please assist your child at home with their rapid recall of times tables. The children will all have access to Times Tables Rockstars which will help in this area. The children would particularly benefit from learning their 2,3,4,5,8 and 10 times tables
