Dear Parents,



This half term our topic is 'Earth and Space'. Please take some time to talk to your children about the topic, read books and stories, watch programmes and think of some questions they can explore in class. See the bottom of the letter for recommended reads for the half term.



<u>Literacy</u>

Initially, we will be focussing on recount writing and will write our own Newspaper Reports about a recent alien invasion.

We will then move on to

Science Fiction writing. The children will be reading a range of high quality Sci-Fi extracts, as well as watching short film clips, in order to write their own short Science Fiction story. Their writing will mainly focus on the build-up and creating suspense.

<u>Spellings</u>

Spellings will be sent home on a Friday to practise for a test on the following Friday. The words will be the basis of our spelling sessions throughout the week when spelling rules and patterns will be discussed and learnt. Your child will also be set assignments on Spelling Shed based on the spelling rules that they have learnt. We will continue to test 8 spellings from the most recent weekly list and 2 spellings from previous weeks.

<u>Homework</u>

Homework will continue to be sent out half termly each half term you will receive a home learning menu. As explained on the menu, you must complete the Maths and English activities as well as one RE activity. The rest is up to you. The homework menu will allow you to be creative and imaginative in what you decide to produce.

<u>Maths</u>

We continue to use the Maths No Problem scheme in school with great success. We will be starting with fractions and then move on to decimals and percentages. Children will continue to practice their multiplication tables in class (being tested weekly) and using the Times Tables Rockstars App. Your support of this, at home, is much appreciated. Just as phonics is a key to unlocking reading, rapid recall of multiplication facts unlocks maths for children and underpins all learning.
