
Thank you so much for the support you gave with homework over the last half term. The children brought in an impressive collection of work which they enjoyed sharing with others during our Homework Share.

As our Year 3 children are no longer provided with fruit in school, they are welcome to bring their own fruit for break time.

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Literacy

Our first English unit this half term is exploring the novel The Iron Man. We will read the story together as a class, gathering ideas to create our own independent story when something, or someone, visits Earth. We will be revisiting complex sentences and continue to focus on using commas to separate the clauses when the subordinate clause appears first. We will also be looking again at using inverted commas for direct speech.

We will then work on applying these grammar skills in our own innovation of the Iron Man story. We will be identifying and creating our own complex sentences using a range of conjunctions.

We are also now starting to focus on children proofreading their own work, looking for errors in spelling and grammar and self-correcting.

Reading

Your child will take part in a guided reading lessons throughout the week. In these lessons, they will respond to a range of activities from a chosen text. This half term we are continuing with Roald Dahl's James and the Giant Peach.

Your child will change their reading book whenever they need to. They will be given a chance to change their book every morning. It is your child's responsibility to change their book, however if you feel this is not being done please get in touch.

Please encourage your child to read to you every night at home. Children are awarded certificates as they reach targets for the number times they read and the number of books they complete.

Maths

We will be continuing to look at Money. It would be helpful if you could support this at home by speaking to your child about the value of each coin. Also, allowing them to work out change from the shop and find the correct money to pay.

We will then continue working on telling the time.

We will use both analogue and digital clocks to tell
the time to the nearest minute. We also solve
word problems involving time.

The children will also continue to read, discuss, and work through a range of word problems throughout their Maths- No problem! Workbook.

Please assist your child at home with their rapid recall of times tables. The children will all have access to Times Tables Rockstars which will help in this area. The children would particularly benefit from learning their 2,3,4,5,8 and 10 times tables.

Times Tables and Spellings

Spellings will be sent home each Friday for a test the following week. Please practice these at home as much as possible. Spellings will be set on Spelling Shed each week, the children love this website!

In addition to spellings each week, we will also be practising times tables on a weekly basis. Initially, all children will start on their 2 times tables, moving on once they are secure to 5s, 10s, 3s, 4s and 8s.

Homework

The new homework menu has been reduced to help make it easier for families to manage. We would like you to focus on reading every day, practicing your child's spellings and a weekly maths task on MyMaths. We would also like you to complete the RE task over the half term and as many of the optional activities as you wish.
