# Year 6 Curricular Letter




# Summer 1

#### LITERACY

Our daily English sessions will predominately focus on SATS revision over the next few weeks. We will go over all previously taught grammar skills to ensure the children are well clued up with the terminology and application to ensure we are providing them with every opportunity to succeed within their SATS. We will also spend time practising reading comprehensions and looking at how to approach each style of question to gain as many marks as possible. After SATS, we will delve back into creative writing based around our Guided Reading book of Wonder. In addition to this, the children will also begin rehearsals for the Year 6 production which we promise shall be quite the spectacle.

#### MATHS

For maths in Y6, we are continuing to use the White Rose Hub scheme of learning, supplementing where necessary with Maths No Problem and testbase. This half term we are completing the unit on Geometry. We will be learning how to measure and find missing angles, draw shapes accurately and use known facts to solve angle problems. In addition to our maths lessons, we will also be revisiting and revising previously taught topics from the KS2 curriculum.

Please continue to work on recalling times tables as mentioned in previous newsletters as it really is vital that the children are able to recall times tables quickly as this helps them in so many other areas and will have a real benefit in the work for this half term. If possible, work together to ensure that your child is proficient with both column multiplication and both of our methods of division - chunking and bus stop (short method).

## <u>READING</u>

Every child in school is given a school reading book and has the responsibility to change their own book when finished or when they are ready for a change. We have invested heavily in the new reading scheme and indeed the calibre of the home readers is truly phenomenal. Year 6 children are expected to read aloud to an adult three times a week. Despite the children being older, it is still equally important for them to be listened to by an adult and questioned about what they have read e.g. why a character has behaved in a certain way; what do they think could happen next, what language they have found challenging or indeed interesting. As the books get more in depth, it might be an idea to share the reading to maintain the interest. If children are enjoying their own books at home, this is sufficient for their reading book as long as it is appropriate and healthily challenging.

#### Homework & Spellings

This half term, we have prepared a homework menu for the children. However, we do appreciate that you may wish to spend the time focussing on SATS revision using the Easter packs, LBQ, Oak Academy or the BBC website. Furthermore, we will not be setting weekly spellings but we do still encourage the children to practise the spelling lists on Spelling Shed. Each week, we will be rewarding the children who have been onto Spelling Shed for at least 15 minutes in the past 7 days.
