## Summer 1


Dear Parents,

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## Literacy

Our first English unit this half term is exploring Limericks in our poetry unit. The children will read and analyse the structure and meaning of different Limericks before making their own. The children will then have an opportunity to perform their poetry in class.

Later in the half term we will be looking at explanation texts. We will be developing our research skills and how we analyse and evaluate the importance and meaning of the information we read. We will read a range of non – fiction and fictions texts, identifying their purpose, audience and structures. This is also a great opportunity for the children to build on their increasing vocabulary and challenge themselves to use more adventurous, factual vocabulary in their writing. Our grammar focus for this unit will be looking at the perfect forms of verbs, eg I watched TV last night. Whilst continuing to embed previous learning on complex sentences.

## Reading

Your child will take part in a guided reading lesson every day. In this lesson they will respond to a range of activities from a chosen text. This half term we are going to be reading Henry's Freedom Box.

Your child will change their reading book whenever they need to. They will be given a chance to change their book every morning. It is your child's responsibility to change their book, however if you feel this is not being done, please get in touch.

If you have any concerns regarding your child's home school reading book please get in touch.

## Maths

We will start this half term continuing to learn about Time. It would be helpful if you could support this at home by speaking to your child about telling the time and working out what time an event will finish eg if a match starts at 3:30pm and last for 45 minutes, what time will it end?

We will then be moving on to learn about fractions. I will be setting some work on My Maths to support this.

The children will also continue to read, discuss, and work through a range of word problems throughout their Maths- No problem! Workbook.

Please assist your child at home with their rapid recall of times tables. The children will all have access to Times Tables Rockstars which will help in this area. *The children would particularly benefit from learning their 2,3,4,5,8 and 10 times tables.*

## Times Tables and Spellings

Spellings will be sent home each Friday for a test the following week. Please practice these at home as much as possible. Spellings will be set on Spelling Shed each week.

In addition to spellings each week, we will also be practising times tables on a weekly basis. This time we will be learning to recall the division facts for the times tables we have already learned.
